A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Some people wonder way we had a garage sale. I have known people who found the idea of a church garage sale offensive, yet many churches do it. Often it is done to raise funds for a specific activity or project. But it also serves a greater purpose.

Our garage sale did several things besides selling our excess stuff.

- 1. It reminded people in the neighborhood that we are alive and doing the work of our Lord. While anyone who drives by on Sunday mornings knows we are here, many people are not out on Sunday mornings.
- 2. We got a chance to talk to people we might never have met otherwise. They got a chance to see who we are and interact with us on a very human level.
- 3. We shared our faith by giving each person a Jesus Loves Me pin and a praying hands craft piece. These were well received with people often asking if they could have extras for other family members.

One young boy was given a pin and shyly asked for others for his brothers and sisters. We gave him enough for his whole family. It is through simple interaction like this that we shared the love of Christ with strangers. And strangers become friends.

To share the joy of Easter you don't have to have a perfect moment, just a passing kindness shows His love. You don't have to preach at people, just love them. You don't have to force them to become Christian, you just have to be a Christian in all you do. Modeling Christ-like traits will show people that God loves them.

As we move from the celebration of Easter to the long hot Texas summer, be sure to treat everyone as loved and important people.
